Alexandre Fortin and Simon Charbonneau are the first 2022 winners

Very competitive races mark this inaugural event of 2022 despite the extreme weather conditions



The Nissan Sentra Cup kicked off its second season of racing at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park in Ontario this past weekend. Two races were held and saw Alexandre Fortin and Simon Charbonneau each take a victory.

No less than seven new drivers entered the Cup this year and, among them, young Justin Arseneau who competed in the US-based Formula 4 open-wheel series last year. Aboard his ICAR Nissan Sentra, Arseneau made an impressive debut in the Cup, claiming pole position in the first qualifying session on Saturday. The intensity of the battle at the front of the field with these near-series Nissan Sentras was demonstrated by the fact that the seven fastest cars were separated by just one second.

The first race started as a severe thunderstorm was brewing in the region. Justin Arseneau, Alexandre Fortin and Simon Charbonneau fought hard for the lead, but after just three laps of racing a violent storm and extreme winds stuck hard. A widespread power outage in the region and a tornado threat brought the race to a premature end. Alexandre Fortin was declared the winner in front of Arseneau, Normand Boyer, Valérie Limoges, Daniel Fortin, Sylvain Ouellet, Frédéric Chaput, Jean Audet, Nicolas Miron and André Lapointe. François-Angers Routhier captured victory in the Micra class.

Rain welcomed the competitors on Sunday for Race 2. Simon Charbonneau started the 40-minute race in third place and powered into the lead in Corner 1 ahead of Arseneau and Fortin. Fighting to find some grip on the very slippery tarmac, the Nissan Sentra Cup drivers put on a terrific show for the fans.

Arseneau managed to slip into first place shortly after the halfway point mark, but he made a minor excursion in the grass that allowed Charbonneau to move into first place. From then, Charbonneau was en route to a brilliant maiden victory in the series. Arseneau, Alexandre Fortin, Limoges, Miron, Ouellet, Daniel Fortin, Nicolas Barrette, François Angers-Routhier (Micra class winner) and Raphaël St-Pierre completed the top 10.



The event also featured track parades on Saturday and Sunday of Canadian Nissan Sentra owners, including members of the Ontario Z Club. These parades, led by the brand-new Nissan Z, offered spectators the opportunity to admire vintage 240s, 240SXs, 280s or even 510s alongside more modern models such as the 300, 350 and 370.

After a season in Open wheel racing, in the highly contested U.S. Formula 4 Championship, Justin was quick to demonstrate his talent at the CTMP: two pole positions, two race fastest lap records and two second places finish. The first victory is not far away as Justin Arseneau occupies the first place of the championship after two races!

Simon Charbonneau had a rather complicated rookie season last year. In the first race of 2022, a missed overtaking attempt forced him to retire. Deliverance came on Sunday, with a first-ever victory in the series acquired in a very spectacular way. "I will feel less pressure," says Simon, who adds: "It's a good start to the season. It was slippery a lot on Sunday, as the track was wet and tricky. Despite everything, I stayed the course. I wasn't looking back, but I knew very well that my rivals were there. It's so competitive in the Nissan Sentra Cup! But at the restart, I managed to distance myself from the group. I'm so happy with this first victory, which comes just before the Canadian Grand Prix in a month's time. It sets the table for the rest of the season as I'm aiming for the title."

INTERVIEW Alexandre Fortin

Rookie class runner-up last year, Alexandre Fortin started 2022 with a victory. The driver of the Ste-Foy / Beauport Nissan team looks back on this feat that already positions him as one of the favourites for the title.



Alexandre, what are your goals for this season?

After winning two races last year when I was a rookie in motorsport, I'm aiming for the title this season, that's clearly my goal. That said, with my father now as my teammate, I want to maximize the fun of competing in the Nissan Sentra Cup events. At the CTMP, during testing on Friday, we followed each other for a long time, I showed him the right apex in the corners, etc. It has been 30 years since he had driven on this track! So I would say that my two goals for the 2022 season are the title and to experience fun on track with my father.

Let's talk about this third father-son duo in the series (with the Barrettes and the Chaputs), is this situation special for you?

It's very special, because he has always been there since I started racing at the age of 6. He has done a bit of motorsport himself but we have never driven against each other in the same category. The Nissan Sentra Cup has made that possible this season! We had always teased each other by saying "I'll end up in front of you one day" but here, it's concrete. I let him get into the rhythm for the first event and after that, he's going to be good! Without laughing, it was beautiful for me to ride with him. We stayed in communication the whole time during testing. We come in the series as a family, my grandfather is part of the team, he also drove in the past.



What is the involvement of Ste-Foy and Beauport Nissan dealers in your program?

It is thanks to them that we are on track and that we are able to enter two cars this year. I don't think we could have considered being on track without their help. When we have small problems during the week they are always there to help us. We are always in communication with them, even during the race weekend when we have to change parts on the car.

How do you see the upcoming events?

My victory on Saturday took a while because I didn't have a good start and then I "played a little hard" with Charbonneau for a few corners. It was fun anyway. On the last lap, when I had regained the lead, Justin Arseneau passed me on the grass. He was of course penalized for that but it was really a fun race. I think this spectacular battle we've had at the front bodes well for the rest of the season.

NEXT EVENT
