


Alexandre Fortin and Simon Charbonneau first 2023 winners of the Nissan Sentra Cup

Two highly contested races at Circuit Mont-Tremblant that promise an exciting new season for the Canadian motorsport series

It was this weekend, under the sun and in summer temperatures, that the first event of the 2023 Nissan Sentra Cup season took place. Two races presented on the famous Circuit Mont-Tremblant, in the heart of the Laurentian mountains, in Quebec, won by Alexandre Fortin and Simon Charbonneau.

For the first time since the early Sentra years (2021), the series featured both races on the same day, with the schedule revised by Series' officials after the Saturday morning qualifying session was stopped following the crash of Sean Scully (Micra class). Qualifying, presented on Saturday afternoon, saw Alexandre Fortin take both pole positions, ahead of Nicolas Barrette for race 1 and Simon Charbonneau for race 2.



Sunday morning, the first half of the race 1 was marked by the spectacular battle at the front between three drivers: Fortin, Charbonneau and Barrette. A restart just 5 minutes from the end saw Samuel Rowe, a series regular but starting this season in a Sentra, join the group of contenders for victory. Charbonneau then managed to climb into the lead, passed Fortin who had led until then, but the driver from Quebec regained the first place on the next lap. Alexandre Fortin finally won this first race of the season, ahead of Rowe, Charbonneau, Barrette.

Nicolas Barrette then recovered third place following a one-position penalty imposed on Simon Charbonneau.

For fifth place, Daniel Fortin, Alexandre's father and his teammate with the Ste-Foy Nissan team, resisted pressure from Nicolas Miron and Sylvain Ouellet until the end. Quebec TV and radio host Benoît Gagnon took eighth place for his very first race at the wheel of a Sentra, ahead of 2022 champion Valérie Limoges, and Jean Audet.

In the Micra class, Simon Vincent returned to victory, dominating the entire race. Nicolas Lévesque and the defending champion of this category, Raphaël St-Pierre, completed the Top 3.

As the temperature exceeded 30 degrees Celsius, the second race started like the first, with Fortin, Charbonneau and Barrette in the first three places. But Alexandre Fortin was forced to retire halfway through the race, his muffler having come off, which made him exceed the noise limits authorized at Circuit Mont-Tremblant.

That paved the way for Charbonneau to victory, with Barrette behind and Rowe completing the podium. Daniel Fortin and Vincent Lalande followed. At just 15 years old, Lalande was making his debut in the series and he was impressive throughout the weekend. Nicolas Miron, Christian Thibault (also a rookie this season in the Nissan Sentra Cup), Sylvain Ouellet, Benoît Gagnon and Valérie Limoges completed the Top 10.

For her first event at the wheel of a Sentra, Marie-Soleil Labelle finished eleventh (thirteenth in the first race) while in the Micra class, it's another perfect race for Simon Vincent, who finished ahead of Nicolas Lévesque and Charles- Etienne Boucher.







Sentra debut and TV documentary for Benoît Gagnon

Popular Quebec radio and TV host, Benoît Gagnon made his Sentra debut at Circuit Mont-Tremblant, after taking part in several races in the past in the Micra class. At the wheel of the Nissan Sentra #20, a car from veteran Sylvain Ouellet's team, Gagnon was also the subject of filming for a documentary that will be broadcast on the Z Télé network on August 21. Benoît will be back in the series for two other events this season, including the Grand Prix de Trois-Rivières.







Simon Vincent dominates the Micra class

Winner of the last races of the 2022 season in the Micra class, Simon Vincent is back this season in the series. At Mont-Tremblant, he again achieved a perfect score in class: pole positions, victories and fastest lap in the race. This performance reinforces the rumor that the young Quebec driver, who likes to split his motorsport season between the Nissan Sentra Cup and the Canadian Rally Championship, is more than ever interested in graduating at the wheel of a racing Sentra before the end of the season!









Vincent Lalande:

THE YOUNGEST DRIVER IN SENTRA!

The Nissan Sentra Cup sees the venue of several new drivers this season. Among them, a young rookie in road racing, Vincent Lalande. Aged 15 and already a triple champion in motorcycle competitions (Mini Superbike), Lalande has achieved a very promising first event. He will compete throughout the season at the wheel of the #13 Nissan Sentra. He tells us about it...

Vincent, what is your background in auto racing?

I started driving cars when I was 13. My best friend Jayden Martorana who competes in Formula Drift convinced my father so that I discovered this series. I then learned to drive with a manual gearbox and did Time Attack at the Complexe ICAR, on the ice. I have never competed in karting. I then chose to get into the Nissan Sentra Cup.

Why did you choose the Nissan Sentra Cup?

Firstly, because the series is very well publicized and is televised. I am convinced that this can open doors for all drivers. Then there's a lot of competition, I can learn from drivers who are better, more experienced than me. It is extremely interesting because you learn more quickly this way. I would say that the Nissan Sentra Cup represents the best series to start, it is very well organized. Finally, the third argument is financial: the budget is very reasonable, that suited me.



What do you like about driving the Sentra?

To ride on slick tires! I had never tried this before. With the Sentra, there is not a lot of power but a lot of grip, the cars are agile and that's what I like. A one-make series allows everyone to set off on equal terms and stand out through driving. As a driver, you improve more with this type of series, the learning curve is faster.

Over the whole season, what is your goal?

I don't have a particular goal but of course a Top 3 or even a victory would be great. I believe that a track like ICAR will give me more advantages because I know it very well. I still need track time with the Sentra to improve, although I'm happy with my lap times for this first weekend. I also know the CTMP well on which I rode my motorcycle. I still have to discover Trois-Rivières, which I did a lot on a simulator. I can't wait to see how it will turn out.

For the future, what are the ambitions in motorsport?

Like many drivers, I would love to become a professional driver, have a wheel and be paid to race. The rally attracts me a lot but my age currently prevents me from doing it for the moment because I have to start by obtaining my driving license. This season, the main goal is to make good progress in the Nissan Sentra Cup.
